CURRICULUM

The rigorous school curriculum is guided by the Cambridge International from Grade 1 to Grade 10 with the option of IBDP and Cambridge 'A' Levels at High School.

The school inculcates a spirit of international mindedness and global citizenship through activities embedded in the curriculum at various levels with schools across the globe. Students get an opportunity to interact with other ethnicities and understand that students of their own age group are different but similar in many ways across boundaries. The aim is to create an aspiration among students to become lifelong learners.

Life Skill Classes are conducted in a supportive learning environment from Primary to High School. The sessions aim to strengthen thinking skills, social skills, personal-self management skills, emotional and mental health.

High school students collaborate with teachers to conduct sessions for Junior High School students. Students engage with the Nahar community through activities, workshops and webinars.

ASSESSMENTS

The Cambridge A Levels program allows students to choose from a wide array of subjects across various disciplines, including Sciences, Mathematics, Humanities, Languages, Social Sciences and Creative & Professional.

Students typically select four to five subjects based on their interests and career aspirations. Each subject is assessed through a combination of written exams, practical exams (where applicable), and coursework. The program offers an in-depth knowledge in chosen subjects and it encourages analytical thinking, research, and problem-solving abilities.

The IB Diploma Program prepares students for success at university and life beyond by fostering critical thinking, intercultural understanding, and a strong sense of global citizenship.

The IBDP curriculum is composed of six subject groups and three core components. The Subject Groups include Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics and The Arts. The core components are Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay and CAS.

Students choose one subject from each group, ensuring a broad and balanced education. Three subjects are taken at Higher Level (HL) and the others at Standard Level (SL). The program fosters critical thinking, research, communication, and self-management skills. Its rigorous assessment standards and comprehensive curriculum ensure that students are well-prepared for the demands of higher education.
