
### Chemistry Adventure: States of Matter








### Unveiling the Microscopic World: A Hands-On Cell Exploration \*


I get lost in the depths of my own soul, And the emotions that make me feel whole. I explore the corners of my heart and mind, And the memories that I've left behind.






### Book Clubs and Beyond


### Grade-wise Contributions:

Nahar International School's Independence Day celebration left students with lasting memories and a deeper understanding of their nation's journey to freedom and progress.









